#### Training - Not Hazing, Prepares New Brothers

Sound Off, Pledge. These all too familiar words were the hallmark of the pre-membership period for most of us. The traditional superior brother and inferior pledge was supposed to test the "unblending" loyalty and commitment, but was often merely a confrontation of wills at best and a postponed hostility at worst. This entire philosophy has changed for the 1982 era potential brother.

Beginning with the 1952 ban on hazing initiations and culminating in the 1970 adoption of the New Direction, the Order began to emphasize preparation for brotherhood rather than the capacity to endure physical or mental stress. "Training" became the keynote. An optimum eight week period was designed to familiarize the trainee with Chapter membership and give him an actual taste of a busy activity schedule.

Groups of prospective members are organized into a "pledge class" or "training group" and begin with individual committee assignments. Prior to induction, they must hold a successful Parents Affair, athletic event, religious undertaking, fund raising project, a social, a stag affair, a community betterment drive as well as

publish a newspaper or flyer. Weekly "mock" meetings are held to teach the effective use of parliamentary procedure and the Handbook is studied thoroughly. A constructive initiation (defined as a days' work for a civic institution) and a Handbook test complete the program.

Sigma Alpha Rho today remains an organization of substantial commitment for its brothers. There is no better place to begin that commitment than during the pre-brotherhood status.

Sigma Alpha Rho was established in 1917. It's development through the next fifty years continued at an unparelled rate. National depression, World War II, Korea, nor the end of "Camelot" hampered SARs' growth from a simple eleven member social club to an international fraternity.

By the mid-1960s' Sigma Alpha Rho was the largest and strongest of any independent youth organization in the world. Our Emerald Eye" gleamed from Camden to Hollywood and from New Orleans to Montreal.

Good things seldom last and SAR was no exception. By the end of our first fifty years the mood of our country (and of the entire world) had begun to change. Our youth, faced with events such as Viet Nam, drug use, and a national craze to "do your own thing" were confused. The pride of group activity and collective effort had been replaced with slogans and long hair.

As with all social changes, the intelligent and middle class youth were affected the greatest. This, of course, was Sigma Alpha Rho. Leaders left, chapters died, activity came to a stand-still, and

a once great organization with a still great idea, was grasping for its' every breath.

The close of our first half century had brought with it the end of an era and the start of a challenge. The summer of 1970 marked the first step in our fight for survival. I see no need to go into details but will say that it was alumni committment and concern that kept Sigma Alpha Rho alive.

A dozen years have passed. Alumni time, effort, patience, and experience have all been directed at the revitalization of Sigma Alpha Rho. This effort has been a great success. Not only has SAR survived, it has strengthened and it has grown.

As an "active" alumnus, I take pride in SARs' accomplishments. Having been a part of its' oncegreat past, having endured its'

lows, and having played some role in its' recovery, I view the present fraternity with pride and await its' future with hope.

The active brothers of SAR owe a debt to the alumni which they can never repay. However, in all fairness, we, the alumni, owe a special debt to them. For as long as Sigma Alpha Rho lives. wherever and whenever we hear its' name or view its' accomplishments, we are reminded of our own youth, our own good times, and our own dear friends. As long as Sigma Alpha Rho lives, so will our memories ..... and as long as we have our memories we will be young forever.
