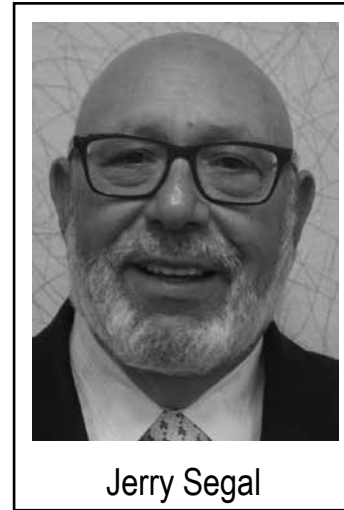

The attendance here today is testament to the impact that SAR had on our lives during our High School days. Many Alumni in attendance today have traveled from California, Arizona, Florida, New York, Maryland, Texas, New Orleans, and from many other areas around the country and Canada. The comradery and Brotherhood that we experienced during our active days can only be envied by other Youth Organizations. The Conventions, the Conclaves in various cities (New Orleans, Montreal, Toronto, New York, Wilkes-Barre, Wilmington, Baltimore, Atlantic City etc. etc.) only helped to foster the bond that we had for each other. I am sure that everyone has stories about the long bus rides to Conventions or Conclaves in other areas. In later years many other Youth Organizations saw the advantages of traveling and have incorporated traveling to other cities as part of their programs. Trust me, their members will never come close to experiencing the bonds, friendships and Brotherhood that Sigma Alpha Rho Alumni have.

In closing, I want to again thank everyone for attending this Reunion and for making the decision in High School to join Sigma Alpha Rho. Also thanks to the Alumni Association for entrusting me with the honor of serving as President.

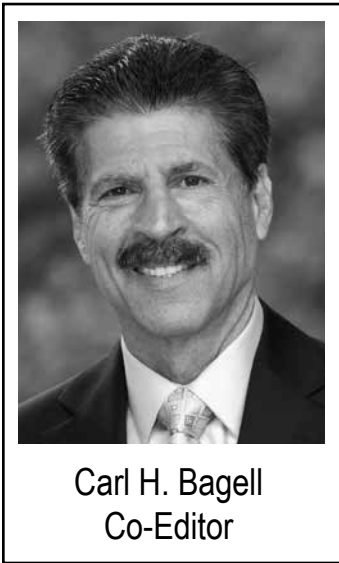

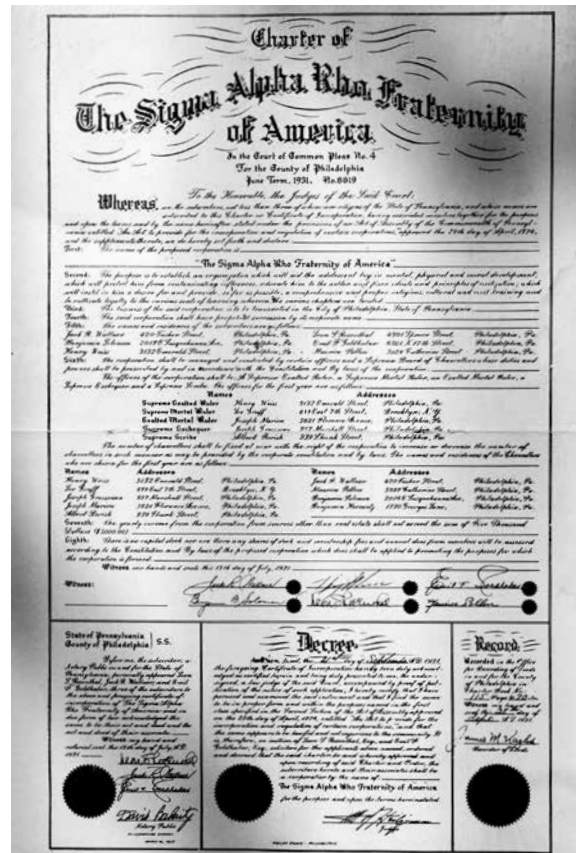
INTERNATIONAL HISTORY

1917 - 2017

This is the story of eleven young men and what they made possible. This is the story of a small Philadelphia social club and the Sigma Alpha Rho Fraternity it founded. This is the story of Brotherhood, of Fraternity, of a spirit united by one oath engendering self-learning, responsibility, and cultural aspects that modeled youth into men - men prepared to meet the problems of the world.

In September 1917, the United States had entered the First World War, while the "Soathical Club," a young group of boys, mostly students at West Philadelphia High School, came into being. They were tired of the close-mindedness that prohibited Jews from participating in social and athletic organizations and created their own. But this Social and Athletic Club, as a club, was to have a short life. As destiny would have it, upon the suggestion of William Braude one November evening, less than two months after the group's birth, the "Soathical Club" became a fraternity. William Braude, Jules Feinstein, Joseph Marion, and Benjamin Landau created the ritual and on November 18, 1917, Sigma Alpha Rho Fraternity was founded. Soon thereafter, Sigma Alpha Rho began to grow. The Gleaming Eye, created by Alexander Meisel, became known as the Fraternity pin, and royal purple and white became the Fraternity's colors. For three and a half years, the Fraternity consisted of the Phi Chapter and acted as a single unit, but then a decision to expand was made. On the evening of June 10, 1921 on the roof garden of the Lorraine Hotel in Philadelphia, ten students of Central High School solemnly took the oath of induction and became the Sigma Chapter. One by one, chapter by chapter, Sigma Alpha Rho grew. Theta, Omega, Iota, Xi, and Epsilon were just the beginning. A governing body was set up and more chapters were formed as Sigma Alpha Rho reached out in one broad, fan-like motion. Leon S. Rosenthal became the Fraternity's first Supreme Exalted Ruler. On January 20, 1924, the Philadelphia District Council came into being, organized to supervise and unify the activity of the Philadelphia Chapters.

In February 1924, the Gleaming Eye, the national newspaper, made its initial appearance. The first convention was held in August of that year in Atlantic City, New Jersey. Soon, the need for a more localized government was recognized as additional chapters in the New York area were inducted. Therefore, the Metropolitan District Council was organized. Later that year, a third Council, the Western Pennsylvania District Council, came into being.

A dramatic high point of this period was the induction of the Theta Theta Chapter of New Orleans, Louisiana, on December 29, 1929. But soon the Great Depression came and the very survival of the Fraternity was an everyday consideration. Plans were made, and the Sigma Rhos of each chapter began to meet. Hence, the first Sigma Rhos' conclave was held at Hotel Walton in Philadelphia, on December 3, 1933. With signs of recovery, the first issue of the handbook was published in 1937, and the Mid-Southern, Southern, and Central Pennsylvania District Councils were established by 1939.

But again, with the outbreak of World War, strains on the fraternity ensued. Many Brothers would be missed at future Conventions as a result of the new Nazi terror. Some, like Supreme Exalted Ruler Irving Rathblott, would perish in this great tragedy.

At the 1942 Convention, SAR started its "Ambulance Fund," which saw the Fraternity donate \$3,100 for the purchase of two US Medical Corps ambulances. They were presented to the Army at ceremonies in Philadelphia and Washington in 1943.

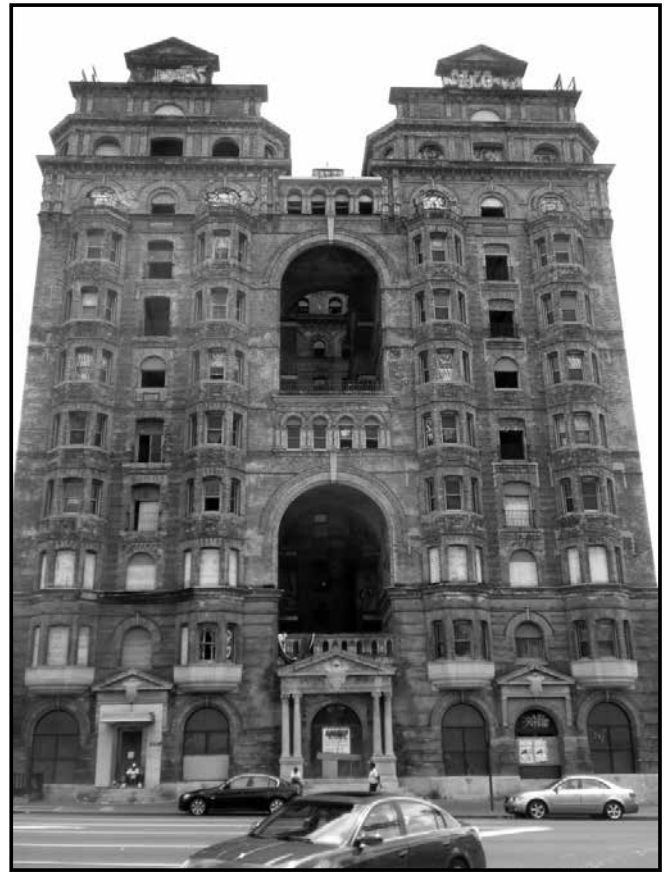
On January 20, 1945, Sigma Alpha Rho, in an impressive military ceremony in Philadelphia's Fairmount Park, planted a tree and dedicated a stone plaque in memory of the Fraternity Brothers who paid the supreme sacrifice in World War II. The tree will serve forever as a living memorial.

During these challenging times, new leaders rose up to guide the dispirited Brothers. Supreme Exalted Ruler, Harold "Whitey" Weissman, dubbed the slogan, "Gung Ho", to mean Work Together. The 1946 "Victory" Convention started off the post war era with a gigantic celebration. Some 800 Sigma Alpha Rho Brothers crowded into New York's Henry Hudson and Park Central Hotels for this momentous occasion. As time moved on, the first Purple & White Yearbook was published and the Eastern District Council was created in 1946. The financial scholarship became reality when, in 1948, Brother Seymour Zogott became its first recipient. Sigma Alpha Rho joined the Inter-Fraternity Congress of America.

In the 1950s, more progress was made as a Scholastic Achievement Program was initiated and a National Fraternity Flag was adopted. Supreme Exalted Ruler Leon L. Linder oversaw a great commitment to community service, which included a \$6,000 donation for the Society of Crippled Children.

Expansion again became a key, for in 1958, the total chapter roll was up to 50 active groups. Much of this was due to the unfaltering determination of Supreme Exalted Ruler Charles Bogdanoff. In addition, the first

Charity Ball was run to raise money for the Rathblott Scholarship Fund.

Sigma Alpha Rho's growth continued in M. Zev Rose's term as Supreme Exalted Ruler, where the chapter roles increased to 59 and new councils covered both coasts with the additions of the Los Angeles and Queens District Councils.

In the 1960s, Sigma Alpha Rho moved into such areas as Massachusetts, Alabama, California, and even across the border into Canada. In 1964, Supreme Exalted Ruler Gil Abramson inducted the

Gamma Lambda Chapter in Montreal. Sigma Alpha Rho of America became known as Sigma Alpha Rho Fraternity, International.

Major achievements were recognized by Supreme Exalted Ruler Edward Soll, whereas planning and organization became a program in itself for the Fraternity. This helped contribute to significant growth in his term, and continued with the induction of 850 brothers in 1966 in Supreme Exalted Ruler Jeff Elbersen's term.

Large Conventions, conclaves in New Orleans and Montreal, and Sigma Rho conclaves marked some of the key activities in the '60's that was presided over by Supreme Exalted Rulers Richard Weissman and Dennis Cogan.

SAR Turns Fifty! During SER Dennis Cogan's term - on December 10, 1967 at the Bellevue Stratford Hotel in Philadelphia, the toast master, Past Supreme Exalted Ruler Judge Emil F. Goldhaber, spoke to the 700 in attendance (including 25 Past Supreme Exalted Rulers) about SAR being as Great as Ever. Another amazing highlight was the speech by Sigma Alpha's Rho's very first Supreme Exalted Ruler, Leon S. Rosenthal.

As the Vietnam War raged overseas, the Fraternity was led by Supreme Exalted Rulers Bill Glazer and Dana Levitz. To meet the challenge of a wavering Fraternity, an Alumnus was called for the first time to lead Sigma Alpha Rho. Jerry Krader, as Supreme Exalted Ruler, brought a "New Direction" to Sigma Alpha Rho. In the 1970's, Youth leadership became a major role and Chapters again became strong as new leaders emerged such as Carl Bagell, Don Benn, Fred Ratner, Stuart Discount, Gary Discount, and Daniel Rosner. A second or Mid-Year Convention was added, ski trips, Dec. 24th annual bowling parties, major conclaves in New Orleans and Montreal, and the Sweetheart Ball were among the many key activities in this era.

THE TORCH IS PASSED TO A NEW GENERATION

As a new generation of inductees approached their fraternity careers with enthusiasm and vigor, few could have anticipated the strides in quality and diversity that the 80s and 90s would bring.

During the '80s, Supreme Exalted Rulers including Stuart Discount, Brad Heisman, Josh Malis and Larry Blumenthal oversaw increased activity which promoted events every single weekend. Leadership retreats, standardized pledge training programs, the rebirth of the Theta Theta Conclave in New Orleans, the Preakness Conclave, expanding Inter Chapter Relations activities were important to the Sigma Alpha Rho's success.

Alan Roth, Joel Hollander, and Steve Wernick, after achieving Royal Order of the Gleaming Eye honors, all returned to the active fraternity to take on Sigma Alpha Rho's highest position as Supreme Exalted Ruler between the years 1988-91.

Since the 80's, multi-term Supreme Exalted Rulers became more the practice than the exception: Supreme Exalted Rulers serving more than one term included Stu Discount (4 terms), Brad Heisman, Josh Malis, Larry Blumenthal (4 terms), Gary Discount, Marty Hyatt, Mike Mendelson, Robert Malmud, Adam Goldstein, and Jason Saylor who became our longest serving Supreme Exalted Ruler who served over 5 terms.

For decades, Charles Bogdanoff, Chief Justice of the Judicial Tribunal, was proudly a mentor to so many of the Supreme Exalted Rulers and SAR leadership.

The Millennium has brought on changes and challenges, especially in communications and social media. Sigma Alpha Rho developed the SAR website, Facebook pages, mass emails, and the SAR hotline which were examples of new additions to accommodate communications in the new generation. Events, such as Skirmishes, attending sporting events, concerts, ski trips, and a focus on Inter-Chapter Relationships were common.

Rathblott scholarships have grown in size and number. A robust alumni organization celebrates our founding with huge reunions every five years and has embarked on a vocational guidance offering. The original Abbie (for the best chapter) established in 1928 has been encased and an Abbie II is now awarded each year.

Brothers, the story of Sigma Alpha Rho is not at an end. The future of the Fraternity will be written in the zeal and love of Brotherhood and to provide inspiration and encouragement to new generations of fraternal leaders. Our vision, foresight, and courage will forge a future for our Fraternity in the next 100 years.

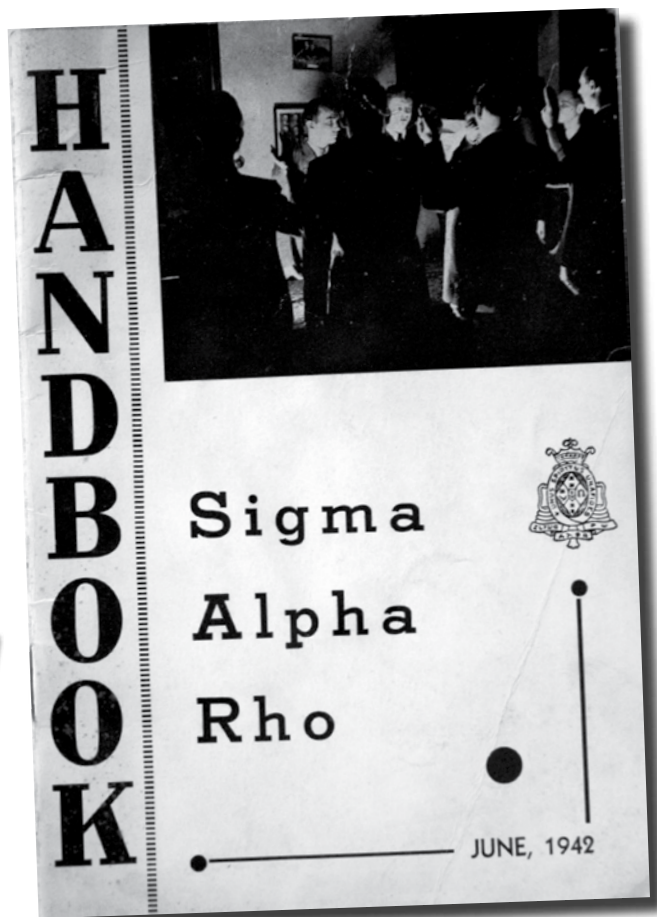

The One Dollar Subscription also aids in financing this sheet. But more than that, it shows the staff that the subscriber thinks enough of its product to back it. Our greatest effort will be expended in printing a paper that is worthwhile. Are we to feel that we stand alone, that your support is absent? Or is it to be that every man in Sigma Alpha Rho is a subscriber? We pray that the latter may be the case.

There is at present a vacancy in the position of business manager. His work consists of supervising the advertising and circulation boards and of being the treasurer of the staff. Here is your chance.

Brother Beryl Price Urges Cooperation

His message, as follows, was requested for publication in the Gleaming Eye:

"Without any preliminary comments, I want to go immediately into a criticism of the state of our fraternity. Our plans are concrete, clear, and concise, and rather than discourse on them here a letter will be sent to every active man in the fraternity thoroughly acquainting them with our plans.

"I can make only one comment concerning existing conditions. Our, like other fraternities, contains one-tenth capable workers and nine-tenths members. Of these ten percent, one percent have the following qualities: dependability, sincerity, and responsibility. Let me implore the other ninety-nine percent of our members to make a sincere effort to acquire these characteristics. Of those men who hold national office and to all but a few this applies, let them in particular take heed for I have not only been disappointed and seriously distressed evidenced lack of these qualities would like each and every one of our Brothers to possess. Let no man in our great work. In doing so, only by repudiating myself a ministrant but each and every one of you S. A. R.

"And in closing I would like I hope this regime will be more visits by men, chapters, and officers than ever before in our history."

Brother Goldstein, Zeta-Nu, seconded the motion.

A small minority put up a stiff opposition to the bill but it was passed by the overwhelming vote of 31 for and 9 against. This bill, according to many delegates, was the only business that encountered any real opposition.

Of the 6 motions presented to the delegates during the convention, this was the only one passed.

INTER-CHAPTER RELATIONS STRIVE ON

UNDER the careful guidance of our new chairman of Inter-Chapter Relations, Harvey Perlish, the members of Sigma Alpha Rho are beginning to know each other. Theta Xi published a chapter paper which showed that a little work on their part enabled far distant brothers to become acquainted with them.

Recently, Sigma chapter visited Theta Iota and a closer relationship was developed. On March 20th in Reading, Penn., Zeta Sigma will hold a conclave and no doubt this affair will help produce a closer feeling between the attending Brothers.

Actual contact is something difficult to obtain, but there is always one way of meeting your Brothers and that is through correspondence. By this means we will build in our fraternity a huge system which will tend to form a Brotherhood close together and make the word "Brotherhood" more than just a word.

No doubt all of you would like to learn what kind of men form your brotherhood. What do they look like? What do they do for a pastime? What kind of girls do they prefer, and numerous other things that could be easily learned through correspondence.

Your Sigma Rho will be more than glad to help you get in touch with Brother Harvey Perlish, 5816 Malvern Avenue, in Philadelphia, who in turn will supply you with a Brother in some other chapter to carry on a correspondence.



Approximately half of the fraternal year is completed, and it is probably well to consider what we have accomplished, and what we may accomplish in the remaining time. I think we can well consider a remark once made, the general portent of which was "There are so many things to do, and so little time in which to do them." This, I think, is typical of what I started out to say.

The fraternity in general has been progressing at least as well as it has in past years. In fact, in general it seems to be in a comparatively better state financially, spiritually and otherwise. And yet, when we attempt to compare it with what might be, we, the leaders of the organization feel that we are standing still. There have been no remarkable inductions of new groups which was one of the hoped for features at the beginning of the year. Several very promising contacts for new chapters have been established, but nothing definite has developed materially. As I said in an earlier message to all of you, if you know of any possibility for new chapters, for the sake of the fraternity, please let us know about them. It is just as essential to induct new chapters into the fraternity at large, as it is to induct new men into the individual chapters.

As for inter-chapter relations, this phase of fraternal activity has been stronger than in past years. At a regional conference held in Allentown on January 16, approximately 14 chapters were represented, and with approximately 80 to 100 men in attendance. One chapter saw fit to hire a bus in order to attend, (the Epsilon Chapter).

Plans are still under way for the formation of District Council composed of Zeta Sigma, Rho, and Gamma Chapters. A similar move is under way for a council composed of Zeta, Theta Nu, Delta, and Zeta Theta chapters. The success of these plans depend upon not only the initiative, but the carry-through of the brothers and chapters involved.

Zeta Sigma has already started plans for a regional conference to be held on March 20. This promises to be (Continued on Page 3)

"The Bomb Got Irv"

Irving Rathblott is gone. Death, ironfaced and silent, came suddenly on January 9, 1945... in the dirty hold of a Japanese prison ship... as it wallowed helplessly under a rain of American bombs in Taku Harbor, Formosa.

Fate insists we believe his number was up. Quietly efficient, a habitual pipe-smoker with groomed mustache, a pleasant voice, conscientious and thorough, practical—he is forever a Sigma Alpha Rho symbol.

No, not because he was twice elected Supreme Exalted Ruler... nor because he authored the present Fraternity induction ritual... nor because he revised, virtually single-handed, SAR's national and Chapter constitutions.

Certainly not because he was Sigma Rho of Omega Chapter (inducted a Brother on Oct. 12, 1922)... nor that he was Exalted Ruler of Philadelphia District Council... or Chancellor, Supreme Exchequer, Exalted Mortal Ruler on the Supreme Board... or Director of Convention when the roof was raised in Baltimore in 1939 (the infamous days that Hitler began his mad conquest into death)...

Irving—"Mr. Sigma Alpha Rho"—lived SAR Brotherhood. He ate it, worked it, slept it—and died it! Now he's memorialized it.

THURSDAY, AUGUST 26, 1926

This morning, everyone registered at the Convention Headquarters, the Breakers Hotel, at New Jersey Avenue and the Boardwalk. The Director of the Convention, Solis Stanford Cantor, was on hand with his capable Board of Governors, to welcome all incoming Brothers.

At 2 P. M. the first session of the 1926 Convention was called to order by the Director and was then turned over to Louis Sherr, the Supreme Exalted Ruler. All the delegates from the various chapters were present and they were presented with a Key to Atlantic City by the personal representative of Mayor Bader. Our S. E. R. was the recipient of the key on behalf of the Fraternity. The session was closed at 5 P. M.

Message from the Supreme Exalted Ruler

1917—There was a war then, too, and things were different then.

World War I had reached our country, but Sigma Alpha Rho felt no change. Events that rocked the country did not change the structure of the fraternity—the organization had just been born, and with the added strength of new blood the fraternity became firm.

1942—World War II. There is a war today, and things are different now.

This war, too, has reached our shores, but now Sigma Alpha Rho has felt the repercussions of world changing events. The structure which was begun twenty-five years ago has grown strong, stronger than those boys in 1917 ever believed.

War has rocked the fraternity—has shaken it terribly! Our brothers have flocked to the service of their country. Our brothers have been heard to be in England, Australia, Philippines, Alaska, East Indies, West Indies, in the Atlantic, in the Pacific, in every state of the union, in every part of the globe.

Sigma Alpha Rho was shaken, but the structure remains firm. Our brothers leaving the fraternity in such vast numbers is not the natural flow of old blood out and new blood in.

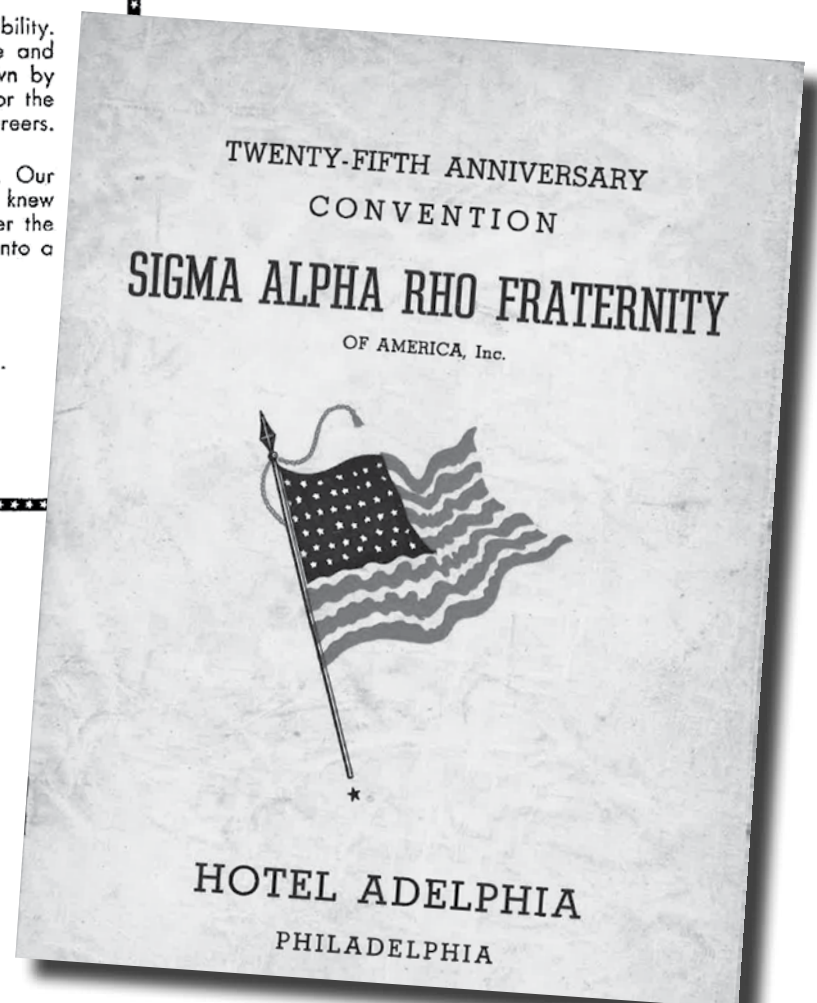
You brothers who yet are in the fraternity have a responsibility. It is you to whom the new men are going to seek guidance and advice. As our men in service are following orders laid down by seasoned and trained officers, so must you lay down orders for the young, untrained neophytes—to shape and mold fraternal careers.

The fraternal structure must remain firm and unshaken. Our brothers in uniform must be able to return to the fraternity they knew when they left. Don't permit the ties to be broken. Tie together the men in service on one end and the new blood on the other into a Gordian knot that won't be severed.

Sigma Alpha Rho must live on!

WAR MEMORIAL

"On January 24, 1945, Sigma Alpha Rho, in an impressive military ceremony in Philadelphia's Fairmount Park, planted a tree and dedicated a stone plaque in memory of the Fraternity Brothers who paid the supreme sacrifice in World War II. The tree will serve forever as a "living memorial."

With these words, the Handbook describes the annual War Memorial Service. Since the printing of that Handbook, Sigma Alpha Rho has added the commemoration of the death of Fraternity Brothers who died during the Vietnam War as well as the late President John F. Kennedy.

The service is laced with tradition. For years, 600 men attended and Past Supreme Exalted Ruler, Harold B. Weissman, was the main speaker. Also on the agenda was and still is the present Supreme Exalted Ruler. Over the years the service has been attended in lesser numbers but the emotion is still there. The presence of a color guard and the magnificent floral arrangements that the Chapters donate add to the service's significance. The March of the Brotherhood initiates the service and the day concludes with a meeting of the Philadelphia District Council.

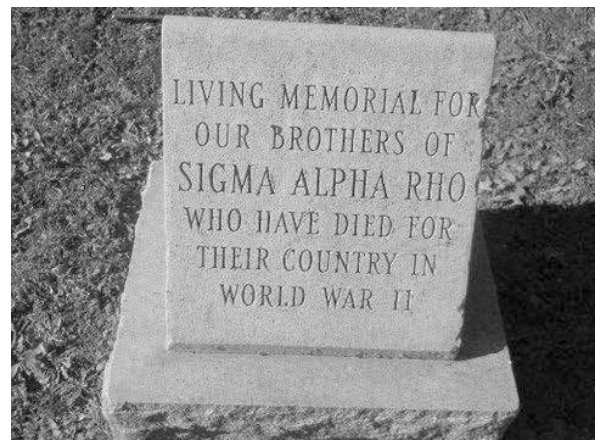

I WENT TO WAR



IRV RATHBLOTT

Irving Rathblott is gone.

Death, ironfaced and silent, came suddenly on January 9, 1945 . . . in the dirty hold of a Japanese prison ship . . . as it wallowed helplessly under a rain of American bombs in Taku Harbor, Formosa.

Quiet, efficient, a habitual pipe-smoker with groomed mustache, a pleasant voice, conscientious and thorough, practical — he is forever a Sigma Alpha Rho symbol.

No, not because he was twice elected Supreme Exalted Ruler . . . nor because he authored the present Fraternity induction ritual.

Certainly not because he was Sigma Rho of Omega Chapter . . . nor Exalted Ruler of Philadelphia District Council . . . or Chancellor, Supreme Exchequer, Exalted Mortal Ruler on

the Supreme Board . . . or Director of Convention when the roof was raised in Baltimore in 1939 (the infamous days that Hitler began his mad conquest into death) . . .

Irv — "Mr. Sigma Alpha Rho" — lived S.A.R. Brotherhood. He ate it, worked it, slept it — and died for it! Now he's memorialized it.

Ironically, the fatal blow was delivered by a B-29. Blame not the Yank airman . . . the prison ship was not identified . . . the bombardier's squint at the target could have revealed nothing more than a junky piece of Jap shipping.

If reports are true, Irv lies buried in an unmarked grave 50 yards off Taku Harbor . . . surrounded by some 70 of his buddies killed with him as they lay sweating and scared — but inwardly cheering the return of the Americans — in the lousy stinking, leaky hold.

Irv was a reserve officer in the U.S. Army Quartermaster Corps — also Supreme Exalted Ruler — when called into service in January, 1941. He was sent to Hot Springs, Arkansas. But a chance for a promotion to a first lieutenantcy, which he achieved, prompted him to ask for an overseas assignment. He finished his second term as S.E.R. in Manila.

He was on Bataan when the Japanese struck at Pearl Harbor. He was captured there in May with Lieut. Joseph Goodman, of Xi Chapter, and Private Lewis Goldstein, Phi Chapter. All three survived the Death March.

Joe was talking to Irv on that Jap prison ship when the American bomb fell.

Irv spent from May 5, 1942 to December 12, 1944 in Jap prison camps in the Philippines. None any good. Then the Japs decided to move the Americans to Japan. The Nipponese loaded some 1200 men into a slimy boat and bedded them down with vermin, rats and man-eating insects.

But American bombs sank that boat before it had scarcely moved out of Manila Harbor, killing 900 men. Irv was rescued with Joe only to be put on another boat and sent to Formosa. There in Taku Harbor you know what happened.

"Irv! Irv! Irv!" he yelled.

No answer. Ever.

AND DIED

IRVING RATHBLOTT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND

In 1946, the Fraternity recognized the need to promote a college education among its members when the National Executive Council created the Irving Rathblott Memorial Scholarship Fund. The Fund was named after our past Supreme Exalted Ruler Irving Rathblott, who died serving the United States in World War II. Scholarships are now awarded yearly to recipients chosen on the basis of scholastic ability, fraternal activity and spirit, and financial need. Winners are selected from applications made to a committee composed of the present Supreme Exalted Ruler and the members of the Judicial Tribunal. The awards are stipends to be used to help defray college costs.

The Irving Rathblott Memorial Scholarship Fund is supported solely through the contributions of the active Brothers and the alumni. Rathblott social nites throughout the Fraternity, drives by the Brothers, and personal donations by the Brothers, their parents, and the alumni underwrite this award. Gifts and donations may be sent to the International Scholarship Fund Chairman or directly to the Supreme Exchequer.

The first Irving Rathblott Memorial Scholarship was presented to Brother Seymour Zogott, Omega, in 1948. In 1950, the Scholarship Fund was temporarily suspended and replaced by the Service Fund for the duration of the Korean conflict. In 1952 the Scholarship Fund was restored and the second award went to Brother Irving Seltzer, Eta.

Several other memorial scholarship funds developed under the Rathblott Scholarship umbrella. Two distinct ones are:

• **Theta Epsilon/ Theta Iota Alumni Scholarship Fund**

This fund raised thousands of dollars for worthy Brothers. The money was raised at an annual breakfast held in the Baltimore area with the Theta Epsilon/ Theta Iota Alumni

• **Warren L. Dennis Memorial Scholarship Fund**

This fund was underwritten by Theta Chapter alumni in memory of 65-66 Theta Chapter Sigma Rho Warren L. Dennis, Esquire for those Brothers attending law school.



12 SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED

RATHBLOTT SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

Of all Sigma Alpha Rho's achievements, unquestionably the Rathblott Scholarship fund affords Brothers the most tangible evidence for a devoted fraternal career. This was especially true for 12 brothers at the Convention award's banquet on September 3, 1962.

Past Supreme Exalted Ruler Harold B. Weissman proudly read the list of recipients. They were:

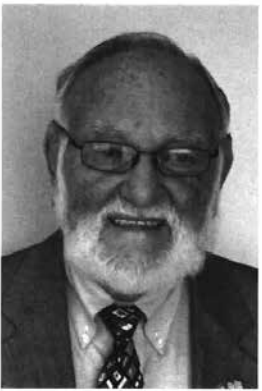

Following the Presentations Brother Weissman spoke to the Brothers concerning their obligation to perpetuate the fund. A phenomenal \$1000 in cash was collected in the room and, an unprecedented \$3100 was pledged by those chapters and councils present. Next year, we hope to double the amount of scholarships given.

Convention Site Is Board Secret But Rumors (?) Say It's Philly

Rumors, however, have it that this year's four-day Labor Day hangover, featuring dances, stags, bull sessions, ten men in a room, and what-have-you?, will be held at the Hotel Philadelphia in you-know-where—Philadelphia, of course.

Just between the devil and a guy named Paul we're inclined to believe these reports, because of the unquestionable reliability of the sources. (Editor's Note: For "military" reasons these informants must remain an editorial secret. But take our word for it.)

800 SAR Men Serving Uncle Sam; 754 Now Active

Sigma Alpha Rho has indeed gone to war—more than 800 strong.

The active membership of the fraternity—based on a Chapter coverage which remained virtually on a par with last year, according to figures released by Ben Dickstein, Omega, Master of the Roll, now in the Army. (His successor is Herb Grant, Zele lota.) The turnover of personnel, however, has never before been paralleled in SAR records.

Uncle Sam has inducted over 200 active men into the army this year with more scheduled to leave by the end of June. Despite that fact—or rather because of it—Chapters have been inducting more than double the usual number of men as in years past, Dickstein said.

We have 754 active men approximately (an accurate figure cannot be given because not all Chapters have turned in reports of inductions as yet to the Master of the Roll). An estimate indicates at least 800 men in the armed forces, with a strong possibility that the figure is closer to a 1000 or more. There are 1166 inactive, 653 associate, 28 deceased, 189 honorary active, 17 national honorary active, Dickstein disclosed.

Ambulance Dedication Is "Greatest Moment" in SAR's 26-Year-Old History

Sigma Alpha Rho's "greatest moment" in its 26-year-old history was written memorably into fraternity archives on Sunday, May 23, as 150

brothers and guests witnessed the dedication of our first United States Army ambulance.

Capt. J. G. Whildin of the U. S. Army Medical Corps accepted the gift in behalf of the government expressing the heartfelt thanks of the wounded in battle who will credit this ambulance—together with the many like them—with the saving of hundreds of American boys' lives.

George Platt, chairman of the second ambulance drive, lives at 3508 White Chapel Road in Baltimore, Md. Send ambulance money to him.

Out-of-town fraternity men joined their Philadelphia hosts in commemorating the gala occasion which started at the 1942 convention at the Hotel Adelphia when two boys broke into the card games and the bull sessions to start the ambulance drive with "pennies, nickels, and dimes."

Philadelphia District Council, welcoming the out-of-town men in attendance, threw a gala dance at the Broadward Hotel the preceding evening. Following the presentation at the 11th Infantry Armory at Broad and Wharton Streets, a stag was held at the Tau Epsilon fraternity house, Leon Linder, Sigma Rho of the Omega Chapter, was chairman of:

The Kiss That Launched the Ambulance Drive

STAN ELKMAN, Past Sigma Rho of Phi Chapter—now married and a happy father, used an empty milk bottle to milk nickels, dimes and quarters from Brothers participating in "those card games" at the 1942 Convention at the Hotel Adelphia in Philadelphia to collect for the Ambulance Fund. Then he wrapped his arms around the pretty singer with Clarence Fuhrman's band—with her permission—and put \$1 into the Fund for the privilege of kissing her. A host of other guys joined in . . . by the end of that Labor Day weekend a total of \$381 in cash was collected with nearly \$1,000 in pledges. Eventually, Sigma Alpha Rho purchased two ambulances at \$1,500 each and spent \$5,000 more for its men in service with *The Gleaming Eye*-Yank and *The Victory Convention*.

Cop Seizes 75 Boys Viewing Obscene Film

Sigma Alpha Rho fraternity's Eta chapter didn't say in its movie ads, but police said they should have had a title:

"No adults admitted unless accompanied by kids."

Unfortunately for 75 members, ranging in age from 14 to 17, an adult did crash their "Monte Carlo night" in a small room behind a barber shop at 3229 Benton Ave.

The adult was Police Sgt. Theodore Schmuck, who became curious when he saw groups of boys going into the building last night. He said that when he entered the room, he saw a film on the screen that turned his ears pink. "It was obscene," he said.

THE 75 BOYS were taken in a cavalcade of police wagons to the Germantown Ave. and Haines St. police station.

The affair was one of several that are held by high school fraternity chapters. But this one, said Sigma Alpha Rho vice president Dave Landau, 19, is the first where naughty pictures were included in the entertainment.

Landau, who wasn't there, is making his own investigation. Those responsible for showing the obscene film will be chucked out of the fraternity, Landau said.

"**OUR SHOWS,**" he said, "accept contributions of 75 to \$1 and the money goes to charity."

On last night's bill was the legit. movie, "The Pleah and

the Fury," starring Tony Curtis. Ads mailed to members also said there'd be cards and surprise films, which Landau said he thought referred to a newsreel taken during a fraternity picnic.

If ETA Chapter's luck had been running, that's the film they'd have been showing when Schmuck crashed the party.

THE MOVIE FANS were questioned for hours at the police station. Sgt. John Snyder headed the interrogations.

Parents of the boys were called and requested to pick up their offspring.

Early today, the last boy was taken home.

mimeograph machine and a smile. Harriet's office then, and for the next nine years, was her home, and 7910 Michener Avenue became S.A.R. headquarters-central.

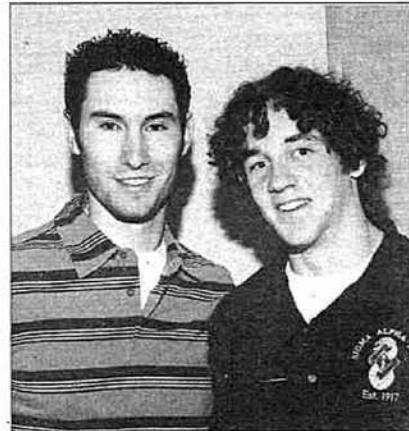

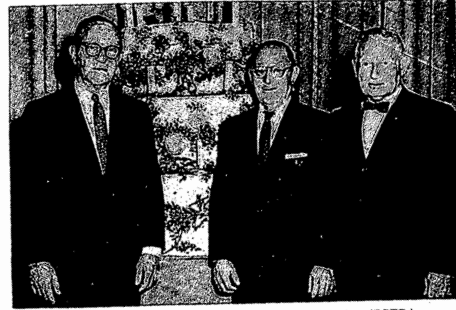

JUDICIAL TRIBUNAL

The Judicial Tribunal is the Court of Appeals of Sigma Alpha Rho. It interprets all constitutional and ritual points after being appealed to by any unit of the Fraternity. The interpretation of the Judicial Tribunal shall be final, subject, however, to constitutional and ritual revision by the International Executive Council in session. The Judicial Tribunal shall have no original jurisdiction – any may interpret only those points and render final decisions on appeals taken to it by the Chapter, Council, or Brother from the constitutional rulings of the Supreme Board of Chancellors.

The Judicial Tribunal shall plan their own procedure. Such procedure, however, must include a notice to all parties involved with full opportunity for them to present their cause to the Judicial Tribunal. The Judicial Tribunal shall have power to subpoena any member of the Fraternity and direct him to appear before any of its sessions to give information on any matter. All decisions in every matter shall be delivered by written opinion.

In addition to being the Court of Appeals of Sigma Alpha Rho, the Judicial Tribunal meets once a year with the present Supreme Exalted Ruler to decide on the recipients of the Rathblott scholarships.

CONSTITUENTS: The Judicial Tribunal is composed of three Justices elected by the International Executive Council for three years. A Brother, when elected, shall not be an active member of Sigma Alpha Rho or a member of the Supreme Board of Chancellors. The Judicial Tribunal shall elect their own Chief Justice from the three Justices.

OUR CALIFORNIA CHAPTERS, HOW THEY WERE FOUND, TRAINED, AND INDUCTED

February 21, 1960, Brother Bob Greenburg, Supreme Scribe and Exalted Ruler of MDC was going to move out to California. He rose and promised to do everything possible to spread Sigma Alpha Rho "Across the Nation". Two brothers then contacted Bob. One gave him the name of a brother in California. The other told Bob he was soon going to move to California.

Within two weeks of Bob's arrival a meeting took place - two brothers and one prospective. S.A.R. was explained to the boy and, as a result, he promised to bring some friends to meeting number two. That meeting saw three prospectives. The following meeting brought seven. The next saw ten - and the "group" became a "contact"

During this time Brother Supreme Exalted Ruler had been notified, and Brother Supreme Exchequer had sent some handbooks.

Approximately six weeks after Bob's arrival the brother who had told Bob of his moving to California contacted him from Van Nuys. The first meeting of the Van Nuys group consisted of nine prospectives. This second contact, about fifteen miles from West Hollywood, was bolstered by the original group.

Now training began in earnest, to each contact was appointed a Sigma Rho, Kappa Beta, and Kappa Mu. Committees such as J. & C. A., Athletics, Sigma, Community Service, and Flyer were appointed. The two contacts played soft-ball and had a contest to see which could learn the handbook better. More handbooks had been received. The boys held card-stags, with ten percent of every game going to the treasury. Flyers were sent out and a newspaper was prepared for induction. The boys went camping together, assisted by a boy-scout leader and brother of Delta Omega.

The groups grew to fifteen boys each. Theta Theta sent them tapes. The boys began to write to Alpha Iota. All the while they studied their handbooks.

The rest is in the history books. Permission for induction was given by the SBC at Charity Ball. The two chapters took their tests and on July 30, under the supervision of Brothers Marvin Spivack and Jerry Shaeffer, Gamma Sigma and Gamma Theta were inducted.



GAMMA THETA

Since that time, both chapters have affiliated with the Jewish Federation of Southern California and newly formed Jewish Community Centers. The groups have also received wide publicity from local newspapers.

This is the work of Brother Bob Greenburg and the Spirit of Sigma Alpha Rho.

Big Hearts in Queens HS Coming To Rescue of a Small Ailing One

Special to World-Telegram and Sun.
WESTBURY, L. I., Jan. 16.—A group of Queens high school boys is going to help two-year-old Susan Enderlein get the heart surgery that may save her life.

The boys, members of a high school fraternity, will help a "Tense Against Cardiac" dance and show next Thursday night at the Bunkers, a night club at 9405 Queens Blvd., Kew-Forest. Proceeds will be used to make a normal life possible for Susan.

The pretty little youngster has a hole in her heart—doctors call it an inter-ventricular septal defect—that must be closed by expensive and complicated surgery.

"We have never sat down and added up all the money we have spent in medical treatment for her," said her mother, Mrs. Gertrude Enderlein, 23, of 80 Land Lane here. "There is no point in adding it up. She is our only child and we have spent what we have had to."

But hospital expenses are expected to amount to \$200 and Susan's father, Walter, 26, works in the engineering department of the National Instrument Corp.'s Synovest (L. I.) plant and attends night classes seeking an engineering degree. The specter of mounting medical bills haunts him.

Some \$1500 of the Enderlein's medical expenses may be met through the efforts of the ten-year boys members of Sigma Alpha Rho, a social fraternity at Forest Hills High School in Queens, and the adult support for its donor.

Susan Enderlein, a usually smiling 2-year-old, manages to smile for the photographer.

Sylvia Purmet Wiener League to aid Cardiac Children. The Enderleins and the boys and never heard of each other until now. The fraternity is holding for this year. In hopes of raising the \$1500. The money will be turned over to the Wiener League to be used for paying some of the expenses of Susan's operation, which is scheduled for July 1, two days after her third birthday.

"Nates" began his fraternal career in 1939 when he was inducted into the Theta Epsilon Chapter. Nates served many positions in Theta Epsilon and his chapter was awarded the Abbie in 1942 and 1943. World War II came and Nates served in the Armed Forces in Europe. Upon his return Brother Strauss resumed his great SAR career. In 1948 Nates was elected Supreme Exalted Ruler.

Upon Nates return from the war, he decided to organize the first Theta Epsilon Alumni Breakfast in honor of all Theta Epsilon Brothers who died in World War II. The first breakfast was held on December 7, 1946 and is still going strong. For over 50 years he has organized this great day and has included his fellow Brothers from the Theta Iota chapter in Washington, D.C.

Named by Nates, "A room full of fraternal love" the breakfast has raised over \$100,000 for the Rathblott Scholarship Fund. Many SAR Brothers were able to attend college because of the generosity of the attendees of the breakfast.

In 1985 Brother Strauss was elected to the Judicial Tribunal and still is an active member. His activity in SAR has spanned over sixty years. When talking about SAR's greatest Brothers, surely Nates is at the top.

The Sigma Alpha Rho Alumni Association salutes Brother Nathan A. Strauss for all he has done and for all he will continue to do for Sigma Alpha Rho.

OUR SUPREME EXALTED RULER

Zev was inducted into Sigma Alpha Rho in February of 1952. He was an active participant in all chapter functions - holding offices of Kappa Sigma, Kappa Mu, and Sigma Rho. During his term as Sigma Rho, Epsilon Chapter won the Pastner Award at the 1954 Convention and the Medoff Award at the 1955 Convention; at the latter Convention Epsilon was runner-up for the coveted Edward Ross Abramson Award.

During the fraternal year 1953-54 Eastern District Council was disbanded and the member chapters affiliated with

Philadelphia District Council. Zev was the first representative of the new chapters to be elected to the Philadelphia District Council Board. He held the offices of Member-at-Large, Grand Scribe and Grand Exchequer. At the 1957 Convention Zev was elected to the Supreme Board of Chancellors. He served as Chancellor of Inductions. During the year he was elected Supreme Scribe to fill a vacancy created by a resignation. The 1958 Convention elected Zev Supreme Exchequer and at the 1959 Convention he was unanimously elected Supreme Mortal Ruler. Atlantic City hosted the 1960 Convention which again by unanimous vote elected Zev Sigma Alpha Rho's 33rd Supreme Exalted Ruler; only the second man from Camden, N. J. - Epsilon Chapter - to attain this esteemed position.

Zev has been an untiring campaigner in his quest to elevate Sigma Alpha Rho to a position of unparalleled greatness. Dynamic progress through creative thinking coupled with the ability and acceptance of responsibility to strive for perfection has been his ritual. Throughout his fraternal career, Zev has inspired and effectively guided the mobilization and completion of programs aimed toward expanding the scope and breadth of Sigma Alpha Rho. He is one man who has conscientiously sought to accomplish defined goals and purposes and therefore has been a vigorous force in the revitalization and reorganization of Sigma Alpha Rho.

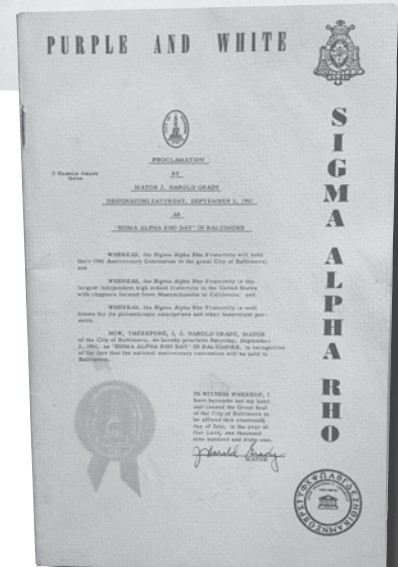
In advocating an expansive program for Sigma Alpha Rho, Zev has personally engineered the induction of eleven (11) new chapters and four (4) reactivations. At the same time he has played a significant part in the re-

organization of a host of other chapters. Realizing the necessity for internal strength through District Councils, he played a prominent roll in the reactivation of Eastern District Council and Southern District Council and in the formation of North Jersey District Council, Los Angeles District Council, and Queens District Council. Under his direction Sigma Alpha Rho held its first five day convention. He edited the Gleaming Eye and Purple and White. Zev was instrumental in perpetuating the latter publication.

During his year as Supreme Exalted Ruler he realized the need for a more efficient and competent communication system throughout the fraternity. Thus, his first decision was to employ a secretary - Mrs. Harriet Millman, whose professionalism shone throughout the year. This year four new chapters were inducted and one chapter was reactivated. With continued expansion the need to reunify and refortify was intense. To meet this challenge a trans-fraternal travel program was developed, conclaves were coordinated prior to convention and publicized extensively by the national body, a new type mailing program was instituted (expanding threefold the number of brothers receiving daily mail), and an information manual for chapters was published. For the first time welcoming letters were sent to every newly inducted man and his parent, as well as sporadic information letters to all of the Sigma Alpha Rho parents. A vocational guidance booklet was published, an extensive and well centralized community service program was presented and the 1931 History of Sigma Alpha Rho was reprinted.

Leadership and strength were generated through the councils. By midsummer Sigma Alpha Rho had seen the formation of L.A.D.C. and Q.D.C. and reactivated S.D.C. For the first time in Sigma Alpha Rho's history (10) councils were effectively operating. With efficiency the password, minutes were sent out immediately following Supreme Board meetings, mailing lists were published approximately every 7 weeks, induction material was sent out quicker, a bid registration system was born, and concentrated jewelry sales were made through order forms. Indicative of the year was the absence of any resignations or removals from the Supreme Board.

This year was indeed a meaningful one to Zev. In addition to his many achievements in the fraternity, Zev and his wife Carol were blessed with the birth of a son, Leon H. Rose. Zev is a second year law student as well as an investment and insurance counsellor. Although Zev would not approve, for he would rather give than receive, our hearts ring out with gratitude and affection for our Supreme Exalted Ruler.

Brother Edelman was inducted into the Beta Tau chapter on January 20th 1973. Ric served as Sigma Rho of his chapter in 1975 and under his leadership won the “Abbie,” and won the Krader Award for Brother of the Year. He later served as Exalted Ruler of the Eastern District Council, which in his words “I was the worst Exalted Ruler in SAR history.” That not holding him back, he served on the Supreme Board as a Chancellor-at-Large. For 30 years, Ric has worked to teach everyday people about personal finance. 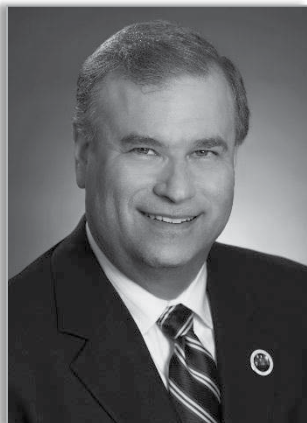
